

gTLD Revocation Readiness Report

This Report summarizes the status of the steps required to request the revocation of a generic top-level domain (gTLD) subject to the terms outlined in the Registry Agreement and the Registry Transition Process. This Report was produced by the ICANN Global Domains Division Operations Team and documents the relevant requirements for Revocation.

Summary:	On 3 September 2015, Registry Operator notified ICANN of its intent to terminate the .DOOSAN Registry Agreement. Subsequent to that request, on 9 October 2015, after consultation with the Registry Operator, ICANN made a preliminary determination that operation of the .DOOSAN TLD need not be transitioned to a successor Registry Operator. On 30 November 2015, after a 30 day period for comments by interested parties, ICANN determined to terminate the .DOOSAN Registry Agreement and revoke the TLD's delegation from the Root Zone.
